Tourists visiting the Okanagan in the summer think little of skiing, but Kelowna visitors this year will be able to check over facilities that will soon give them one of the finest ski resorts in British Columbia.

The proposed ski resort development on Big White Mountain by partners Cliff Serwa and Doug Mervyn of Kelowna, would fill the gap between Ver-non's Silver Star and Pentic-ton's Apex Alpine, and boost the winter tourist economy in the area.

"During the last few years it has become more and more obvious the old Kelowna ski bowl was a lost cause," said Mr.

"First,, because it rarely had enough snow, and secondly, be-cause too few members of the ski club were willing to sacri-fice their ski time to organize and run the area.

"As a past active member of the club, I have seen the club membership decrease, and those who had previously been among the hearty workers, be-gan skiing Silver Star and Apex.

TRANSFORMATION

"Skiing has undergone an amazing transformation during the last 10 years," said Mr. Mervyn.

"With the rapid development of equipment, techniques and

it became possible to reduce the time required to learn to ski. As the sport upgraded its ability, the skiing public demanded better facilities, hills and snow. "A thorough search of possible areas around Kelowna showed one area which stood above all others in potential. This was Big White Mountain. "With an elevation of 7,603 feet it has assured snow even in the worst years. Because of the higher elevation the snow type is consistently of good powder, the ultimate for good skiing. The average snow depth has been between five and eight feet.

PROTECTED SLOPE

With a sunny and protected southern slop it affords warm, pleasant skiing, well protected from the wind. Best of all, Big White has an infinite variety of slopes for all, from beginner to expert," said Mr. Mervyn.

When ski pros Willie Leitner of Silver Star and Carl Hoeller of Revelstoke, visited the proposed area they told Mr. Mervyn "this is an ideal teaching mountain. No one will be afraid to ski here and yet there is torrain for everyone"."

"Runs of two miles and more will be possible and skiers will be able to ski a different run throughout the day and not have






